

Understand your commitment

Be aware of the risks, benefits, costs and incentives associated with doing an apprenticeship. Make sure you can fulfill your employee obligations regarding the range of work required.

Who can do an apprenticeship



- Minimum of 17 years and hold an Open Probationary Licence.
- Applicants with a current truck licence also eligible
- Experienced drivers are encouraged to complete the apprenticeship to recognise professional experience
- Must be eligible to work in Australia.
- Age related licensing requirements - min 18yrs to gain MR/LR and 19yrs to gain HR

How is your Apprenticeship managed?



- Your Apprenticeship Support Network Provider will take care of all the paperwork including training contract and let you know of any funding that may apply.
- Your employer and supervisor will be responsible for managing your training in the workplace.
- A Registered Training Organisation will provide the qualification training delivery.
