Heavy vehicle charges

Transport ministers from participating jurisdictions across the country have agreed to set heavy vehicle charges for a three-year period, to help provide certainty to industry. Commencing 1 July 2023, charges will rise by six per cent each year. This level of increase is considered by Ministers to strike the right balance between the need to move back towards cost-recovery of the heavy vehicle share of road expenditure and the need to minimise impacts on this vital industry.
