

Nambour–Mapleton Road, Kureelpa landslip repairs North Coast Region – Natural Disaster Program

August 2024

The Department of Transport and Main Roads' (TMR) contractor will soon begin landslip repair works on Nambour–Mapleton Road, near Dulong Road, Kureelpa. **A map of the works location is shown on the reverse of this flyer.**

Works will start **mid-August 2024** and will be completed by the end of October 2024, weather and site conditions permitting.



Key works

- Excavating and clearing works.
- Scaling and rockfill to provide stability.
- New guardrail.

What to expect

- Major reconstruction works will take place near Dulong Lookout. There will be minor works undertaken at seven other sites along Nambour-Mapleton Road.
- Works will generally be undertaken Monday to Friday between 6.30am and 6.30pm. If weekend or night works are required, Variable Messaging Signs (VMS) will be used to advise road users.
- During works heavy machinery including excavators, concrete trucks and mobile cranes will be accessing the work site.
- Traffic controllers, reduced speed limits, road signage and VMS will be in place to advise of the changed traffic conditions and to ensure motorist and road worker safety.
- Motorists may experience delays, with single-lane closures of that section during work hours. The road will be open to two lanes outside work hours.
- Nearby residents may experience noise, light, vibration, and dust from construction activities.
- Reversing beepers and flashing lights are a safety requirement and will be used during works.
- Priority access through the work site will be given to emergency vehicles.

TMR understands roadworks can be frustrating for nearby residents, businesses, and road users and acknowledges your cooperation and patience during works.

The Nambour–Mapleton Road landslip repairs are being undertaken as part of a broader program of rectification work to repair more than 200 batter slope/embankment sites across North Coast Region damaged by the 2022 flooding and rain events. The recovery works are jointly funded by the Australian and Queensland Governments through the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).




